# Amateur Radio Parity Act

John NP2B has already sent a "stack" of letters to our elected representatives. We will continue to provide this "reminder". John says.....

Well, the "Amateur Radio Parity Act" has now been introduced in the U.S. Senate as S-1685. And what this means is MORE LETTERS! Dan Henderson of the ARRL called me to discuss this and HR-1301 (the letter most of you already signed). He says that they have only delivered 5 letters to representative Nugent with regard to 1301. Well, soon he will be getting more than 40 more! Dan assured me that these letters DO make a difference.

So with that in mind, send one to Senator Bill Nelson and the other to Senator Marco Rubio. I would ask that you print out each of these letters, sign them and print your name and address below your signature and return both of them to me. They are similar in nature but they refer to separate bills (HR-1301 for the House and S- 1685 for the Senate). I'll take care of getting them delivered to the proper people.
