Category 3/4 Hurricane Matthew "raked" the East Coast of Florida from the Keys to Fernandina Beach (and up the US Atlantic Seaboard) October 6th, 7th, and 8th....coming closest to Daytona Beach (26 miles offshore) mid-day Friday the 7th. Folks generously steered clear of these frequencies and nets, and the net controls were fabulous! It was great to listed to the check-ins and well operated nets.

STAY SAFE! Keep monitoring your local news, NHC, NWS, or whatever to be up-to-date on the storm out there. We still have two more months of Hurricane Season ends November 30th. Hopefully, no more bad storms for this year! We were very lucky.

We talked and visited, and although the Hamfest was visibly "lighter" in attendance, it was still a great time.
